Show Horse Council Annual Meeting

South Coast businessman John Kosseris was recently return unopposed for his third consecutive term as President of the Show Horse Council of Australasia at its Annual Meeting held at Richmond, west of Sydney on the 16th August. This meeting was well supported by affiliate delegates who where joined by SA constituent affiliate delegates, Geraldine Crocker and Helen Degenhardt.

In fact the election of executives held no surprises as one would expect considering the success of the past year. Hard working, long-time Secretary Roma Stonestreet was also returned unopposed as was Treasurer Katrina Williams for her third consecutive term. President John Kosseris thanked all concerned who helped contribute to our most successful year.

Both the Grand National qualifiers run by the Council, namely the 2004 Nature Vet HOTY and the 2004 Hygain Pacific Coast Championships posted record entries with substantial financial returns. The 2005 Trivett Land Rover Grand National again held at the magnificent complex of SIEC at Horsley Park just keeps on growing in stature and is without a doubt our most prestigious event, with Australasia's most elite show horses competing this year before the astute eye of respected international judge, Angela Lance from the UK. Mr Kosseris also paid tribute to outgoing judges coordinator Mrs Alena Farmer, who did not seek re election, this position has been filled by Mrs Leonie Roberts who I am sure will continue on with the good work put in place by Mrs Farmer.

Judges Scheme

Our judge's scheme is currently in the process of being reviewed and updated by the Judges Sub Committee. Some of the area's being looked at includes,

- The criteria needed to up grading to the Royal Show List.
- The formation of a National Judges List. Currently the states of NSW, QLD and WA are the only ones with a Judges List. Robyn Bland has been appointed as the Chairperson of the National Sub Committee to help facilitate this process.


Current Show Horse Council judges are reminded that the end of 2005 brings with it the cut off of the current 3 year period. If you have not attended a judge's workshop in the last 3 years your name will be taken off the SHC Official Judges List. If you attend a workshop during the next 3 year period your name will automatically be placed back on the list without sitting the exam, after that period you will have to re sit the exam.

A recommendation has come from the Judges Sub Committee that affiliates holding workshops need to ensure that lecturers place a lot more emphases on the education of potential candidates sitting the Judges Exam in the area of Conformation & Soundness.

The SHC Manual, introduced in 1997 has been a valuable Reference point for competitors, Judges & Applicants to the Judges List. In conjunction with the Judges Scheme, the Manual is also being updated & should be in place early in 2006.


2006 Trivett Land Rover Grand National Saddle Horse & Riding Championship

Due to the popularity and the ever increasing number of competitors that this prestigious event draws and the time frame needed to judge such large numbers the SHC has decided to extend the gala event to 3 days. Another important change to the format of the forthcoming Grand National will be the use of two U.K Judges. They will judge alternate classes over the three days with the assignment of classes not publicised until the day of the event. As we are all aware the Grand National is an invitation event, SHC Secretary Roma Stonestreet expects to have the invitations posted out by the beginning of December. Country Athletes Scheme

This scheme is designed to assist talented young athletes from the country areas of NSW to gain access to training, coaching and competitions similar to those enjoyed by athletes from the city.

Who Can Apply?

To be eligible to apply athletes must meet each of these criteria; be 17 years of age or under as at 31st December, be competing at state age level in their sport, be permanent resident of NSW, reside more than 80km from the old Sydney GPO and be registered, affiliated or have reciprocal rights with the recognised state body for the sport in NSW.

How much funding is available to me?

The maximum amount of the grant depends on how far in radial kilometres you live from Sydney. **When can I apply?**

Applications open September 30th and close December 31st each year.

How can I apply?
