

## 2016 PACIFIC COAST HACK CHAMPIONSHIPS REPORT.

The Show Horse Council Of Australasia conducted its Sydney based Grand National qualifier over the weekend of 5<sup>th</sup>, 6th & 7th of February at Horseworld, Maraylya. This is the seventh year we have held Pacific Coast at the venue, the indoor arena again proving popular.

Friday's events Newcomers, Preliminary and the Children's classes were held inside to utilise the main indoor & back arenas, Ponies were in the back arena while Hack and Galloway Classes were in the main arena. Classes where well represented in quality and numbers with the children's classes being very strong, congratulations to the children winning classes and qualifying early for the 2017 GN event. The two Leading Rein classes held at the conclusion of Friday events had good numbers in both classes; the Skinner Family donated carrots for the Children's ponies & The Parker Family donated Minnie Mouse & Mickey Mouse toys, for every competitor, and the children loved them.

Grand National qualifying classes followed with excellent numbers in attendance. Over 340 horses, and 145 Riders entered this year. The first year we held Pacific Coast at Horseworld we only had 175 horses, so it is very rewarding to see the popularity of Pacific Coast growing each year after year. On Saturday classes for Ponies, Galloways and Junior Riders were held while Sunday saw Hacks and Adult Riders featured. This format seemed to be very successful finishing the days judging without being rushed and in good time to allow competitors and Judges to return home.

Each competitor in the horse classes are given an individual work out, emulating the conditions the horses would face should they compete at the Grand National. The Judges expressed the standard of Horses & Riders was extremely high which showed as final results in several classes being very close.

Four judges officiated for the show- MS Marcia Beard, (Vic Ponies), Mrs Tanya Benton-Hall (NSW Galloways), Miss Anna Duffy (WA Hacks), & Miss Suanne Vale (VIC Hunters), All working very hard over three very full days of events, the four judges cut a very elegant figure out in the arena having gone to so much trouble to dress for the occasion. The Show Horse Council thanks them for giving up their weekend to spend with us.

Thanks must go to our Major Sponsor Karen Hendricks from SAIGE Accountants & Financial Planners, whom sponsored this event for the third year. We also have loyal class sponsors whom donate in many ways to offer class winners prizes and products.
